Notes On The Readings

Acts 10:44-48: Peter was directed through a Spirit-given dream to break with his Jewish thinking about the uncleanness of non-Jewish people. No conscientious Jew could associate with heathen people, let alone go into their houses. In obedience, however, Peter sought out Cornelius (a Roman army officer) and his household. Here he preached the gospel to eager searchers after the truth. When the same phenomena occurred among these people as had occurred with the apostles on Pentecost day, Peter saw this as a clear indication that Christ was reaching out to them also with his kingdom. Accordingly Peter baptised them, inaugurating a 'Gentile' church.

1 John 5:1-6: To believe in God means that we also love him. Loving God means without any doubt keeping his commandments. Keeping God's commandments assuredly includes loving one's fellow children of God. God's commandments actually put love into practice. Pleasing the beloved Lord in this way overcomes the evil of the surrounding world. As God's Son, Jesus came to us both by his baptism (water) and by his death (blood). Without his life and death we would have no new life or victory.

John 15: 9-17: As the Father has loved his Son, so is there no restraint in the love Christ has for his believing disciples. His love brought him to the incarnation and took him to death so that he might save his disciples. There is infinite joy in sacrificial service. Our love for each other is to be based on the model of his ultimate sacrifice. Properly understanding the choice and friendship he has laid on us, we go out to obey his

commands, love as he loved, and thus bear much fruit. Asking God in harmony with that revelation also yields a rich harvest, namely of answered prayers.
