Notes On The Readings

Hebrews 4:12-16: The word of God is a living, powerful and active thing. God himself is active in it. It therefore has the power either to condemn or to save. It lays bare all guilt and is the standard by which all finally must give account. How encouraging, then, it is that we have a high priest such as Jesus. In the Old Testament God's people needed a high priest who could draw near on their behalf to seek God's mercy. Jesus, our high priest, is both fully human and fully God. Being human, he can understand our weakness and temptations and help us. Being God, without sin, he can grant full forgiveness when we as New Testament priests draw confidently near his throne to seek it.

Mark 10:17-31: The rich young man, being steeped in self-righteousness, thought it possible to find and follow a formula to 'inherit' eternal life. He was blind to the fact that 'do' and 'inherit' are in this sense contradictory. Jesus' testing comment challenged him right at the centre of the sin that possessed him, which he could never admit, namely his own greed (vv 23-27). The last section of the reading shows that if people consider their sacrifices for the kingdom will merit a reward, they will be declared 'the last'. If believers simply follow faithfully in eager abadiance regardless of their sacrifices, they will



in eager obedience regardless of their sacrifices, they will be declared 'the first'.
